

# CM to meet PM on June 17

CHIEF Minister MK Stalin will be meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi on June 17 at New Delhi. This is Stalin's first meeting with Modi after assuming the office of Chief Minister. Stalin is leaving for New Delhi on June 16 and is scheduled to return to Chennai on June 17. During the meeting, the Chief Minister is likely to submit a memorandum relating to the various demands of the State

government including GST dues, Central share of taxes, pending Central allocation for various development schemes, scrapping NEET, etc. During the past one month, he has written many letters to the Prime Minister on key issues and during his meeting, Stalin is likely to reiterate the demands which are yet to be fulfilled, like more doses of Corona vaccines, expediting the process for operationalisation of the Integrated Vaccine Complex at Chengalpattu, etc.

## Minister holds review meet with DISH officials

# Stalin distributes welfare assistance to beneficiaries in Salem

CHIEF Minister MK Stalin on Friday distributed welfare assistance to 10 beneficiaries at the Collectorate on behalf of Ugal Thokuthiyil Muthalachaichar (CM in your constituency) department in Salem. As many as 1,100 grievance petitions have been submitted by the public to the department and welfare assistance was provided to them, said sources.

## 5kg rice bags distributed

## Water release from Mettur

Chief Minister MK Stalin will

be releasing water from the Mettur dam for delta irrigation on Saturday around 10.30 am. The water release will benefit 16 districts for irrigation, said sources. Meanwhile, Stalin urged party cadre not to install banners or cutouts to welcome. Sources said that no banners were installed in the district as per his instructions.

# Ahead of water release, CM inspects desilting works

A day ahead of the opening of sluices of Mettur dam for Kuruvai cultivation, Chief Minister MK Stalin reviewed the maintenance work undertaken at the Pulivalam canal in Tiruchy district on Friday.

In a bid to ensure that water released from the dam reaches even the tail-end areas, the State government undertook maintenance work on canals stretching over 4,061 km in the delta regions at a cost of ₹65.10 crore.

With the works almost complete, Stalin, on Friday afternoon, reviewed the maintenance work undertaken at the Pulivalam canal at a cost of ₹29.70 lakh. The PWD carried

out cleaning works on the canal. Weeds were cleared and bunds strengthened.

Stalin also inspected the renovation work on Kallanai (Grand Anaicut) and special desilting works being carried out in Cauvery delta districts.

The water from Mettur dam is likely to benefit Kuruvai paddy crop on around 3.5 lakh acres in the Cauvery delta districts. Stalin inspected the preparations for water release into the Cauvery and its branch rivers and canals in Thanjavur district.

On his first stop at Kallanai,

he inspected the first phase of work being carried out as part of ₹1,036-crore project on expansion and renovation of water resource structures.

He also visited a photo exhibition arranged at Kallanai on the desilting works being carried at Thanjavur, Tiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Mayiladuthurai, Tiruchy, Karur, Pudukkottai, Ariyalur, Cuddalore districts.

At a meeting held at Kallanai inspection bungalow, he reviewed the desilting works taken up at Cauvery delta districts.

Later, Stalin inspected the desilting of the Muthalaimuthuvaari, the drainage canal at Vallam near Thanjavur. The canal is being desilted to a length of 3.35 km at a cost of ₹40 lakh. Later, he visited Palliagraram near Thanjavur where sand dunes and vegetation were being cleared from the Vennaru to a length of 400 metres at a cost of ₹17 lakh.

## Receives petition

Stalin, who was on the way from Kallanai to Thanjavur, stopped his car at various points to receive petitions from the public, who had gathered along the roadside. He received petitions at Koviladi, Tiruchanampundi, Tirukkattupalli, Budalur north and Budalur four road crossings.

# 'Ensure release of Cauvery water to TN'

POINTING out that the Tamil Nadu government is opening the Mettur dam from June 12 under the justified assumption that Cauvery water would be released as per the monthly schedule fixed by the Supreme Court, Chief Minister MK Stalin on Friday sought immediate intervention of Union Minister for Jal Shakti Gajendra Singh Shekhawat to advice the Cau-

very Water Management Authority in this regard.

"Since delta areas in Tamil Nadu do not benefit from the Southwest monsoon, the Kuruvai crop would be totally dependent on the continuous release of water from Mettur reservoir. Hence, any shortfall in the release of water as per the schedule will severely impact the standing crop as well as commencing and continuing the Samba cultivation, from next month," the Chief Minister

underscored, in his letter to the Union Minister.

Stalin said the quantum of water received at the common border, Billigundulu gauging site of the Central Water Commission, has to be realised as per the monthly schedule fixed by the SC, for ensuring continuous release of water to sustain lakhs of acres of Kuruvai paddy crop. "As per the judgment, we are to receive 9.19 tmc of water in June and 31.24 tmc in July," he added.

# Demand for release of Perarivalan gains momentum as he completes 30 yrs in jail

IT has been 30 years since AG Perarivalan was taken into custody for interrogation in the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case on the night of June 11, 1991, with a promise that he would be sent back the next morning. However, in due course, he was made one of the accused and later convicted. The other six who were also arrested have also spent almost 30 years in prison.

Renewing her appeal to the State government for the release of Perarivalan due to ill health, his mother Arputham Ammal on Friday said, "The government should not send Perarivalan back to the prison, who is now on a 30-day ordinary leave. I appeal to Chief Minister MK Stalin to consider this."

Arputham Ammal also referred to the confession of V

Thiagarajan, a former CBI officer who recorded Perarivalan's statement in 1991, who said that he had omitted a part of his statement wherein he had no idea why the two nine-volt batteries were bought.

Thiagarajan was referring to the batteries he gave Sivasaran, which was used in explosives that killed Rajiv Gandhi and many others.

Meanwhile, PMK founder S Ramadoss recalled the legal battles and the efforts taken by the State government for many years for the release of Perarivalan and others.

Ramadoss said Chief Minister MK Stalin had made an appeal to the President to release these seven convicts. But the State government has to knock the doors of the Governor and not that of the President since the Governor cannot reject the recommendation made by the AIADMK government for the release of the seven convicts.

# 'Sattai' Duraimurugan arrested

YOUTUBER Duraimurugan, host of channel Sattai, was arrested on Friday evening after he allegedly threatened to attack a person for posting content on social media criticising LTTE. The incident came to light after Vinoth, owner of a private car spa, lodged a complaint at KK Nagar Police Station.

According to police, Duraimurugan, with a group of over 20 people, including NTK cadre, allegedly went to Vinoth's shop and threatened him for making a social media post against LTTE leader V Prabhakaran.

"A group of people, including NTK cadre, trespassed into his shop and threatened Vinoth. Following the incident, the victim filed a complaint at the KK Nagar police station," an officer said. Police arrested Duraimurugan, Vinoth, Santhosh and Saravanan under various Sections of the IPC, including Section 143, Section 447, Section 153, Section 506 (1) and Section 506 (2).

## HOW IT UNFOLDED

- Former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi was assassinated on May 21, 1991 during an election campaign at Sriperumbudur
- Poonamallee TADA Court awards death sentence to all 26 accused on January 28, 1998
- Later, the Supreme Court commuted the death sentence of three as life sentences and acquitted 19 others while upheld death sentences for Nalini, Murugan, Santhan and Perarivalan
- The four convicts went on an appeal and their petitions were dismissed by the SC on October 8, 1999
- The State Cabinet meeting chaired by the then Chief Minister M Karunanidhi held on April 19, 2000, advised the Governor to commute the death sentence of Nalini and uphold the death sentence of other three.
- The Governor accepted the State Cabinet's advice on April 21, 2000 and confirmed the death sentence for Murugan, Santhan and Perarivalan
- The DMK government forwarded the mercy petitions of the three to the President on April 28, 2000
- The President rejected mercy petitions on August 12, 2011
- TN Assembly, on August 30, 2011, adopted a resolution moved by Chief Minister Jayalithaa requesting the President to commute the death sentence of the three convicted
- The SC, on January 21, 2014, commuted the death sentence of 15 persons including four aides of forest brigand Veerappan stating that there has been delay in deciding their mercy petitions, thus giving a ray of hope for the Rajiv case convicted
- The Supreme Court, on February 18, 2014, commuted the death sentence of three convicts in Rajiv Gandhi assassination case and said the Tamil Nadu government can exercise its remission powers under Section 432 and 433 Cr.P.C. to release the convicted
- Chief Minister J Jayalithaa chairs TN Cabinet's emergency meeting on February 19, 2014 and decides to release all seven convicted in the Rajiv assassination case. She told the House that if the Centre fails to respond to the Tamil Nadu Cabinet's decision within three days, the State government would go ahead and release them as per Section 432 of the CrP

## However, the then UPA government moved the SC against the decision

In February 2014, the Supreme Court stayed the release of all seven convicts as announced by Jayalithaa and directed the State government to maintain status quo

On March 2, 2016, the AIADMK government decided to release all the seven convicts and sought views of the Centre on the decision

June 15, 2018: President Ram Nath Kovind rejected the State government's plea to release the seven

September 9, 2018: The AIADMK government recommends to Governor Banwarilal Purohit them

March 20, 2020: Nearly after 18 months of State Cabinet recommending the release of seven convicts, the Governor said a decision on the release could be taken based on the report to be submitted to Supreme Court by the Multi Disciplinary Monitoring Agency (MDMA) which is probing the conspiracy angle of the assassination

May 20, 2021: Chief Minister MK Stalin urges President Ram Nath Kovind to accept State government's recommendation made in 2018 for the release of the seven convicts and pass orders to remit the sentences of all these convicts and also release them immediately
